For example, when walking through the silent, snow-covered gardens of Nymphenburg Palace while the rest of the city is snuggling up on the couch. ### Twinkling lights and Christmas magic

During this tour, our guides tell you interesting facts and anecdotes about the past and present-day Christkindlmarkt (Christmas market). The festive, wintry walk takes you around Marienplatz, which, to the delight of its visitors, is decked out for the holiday season. The enormous Christmas tree in front of the Neues Rathaus (New Town Hall), with its countless sparkling lights, creates a mood that is both festive and reflective, while the numerous stalls on the square offer hot drinks, all kinds of culinary delights, and inspiration for Christmas gifts.

# **Christmas markets** in Munich

Munich loves its Christkindlmarkt. So much so that numerous other markets have long since been added to the original Christkindlmarkt on Marienplatz. An enchanting selection.

### 1 Munich's Christkindlmarkt at Marienplatz

The Christmas market with the most magnificent backdrop in the city. The stalls are set up every year in front of the neo-Gothic Neues Rathaus on Marienplatz. Its popularity is also due to the fact that it considered to be Munich's original Christmas market. Its roots can be traced all the way back to the 14th century!

2 Christmas village in the Kaiserhof (Emperor's Courtyard) This Christmas market is tucked away in the inner courtyard of the magnificent Residenz (former royal palace) and well protected from the wind and snow. The stalls, which are run by traditional workshops and display their beautiful wares, are well worth a visit.

Munich's Christmas extravaganza and medieval market Beautifully decorated wooden cottages, performers in medieval costumes and merchants in historical garments bring the Middle Ages to life. City history you can experience live!

### 4 Tollwood – a winter festival

In the winter, Tollwood, a popular "alternative" Christmas market, is held at the same venue where Oktoberfest is celebrated in the fall: Theresienwiese. It entices visitors with a combination of organic food and original handicrafts. There is also an exceptionally varied program of music concerts and other events.

### 9 Pink Christmas, the queer Christmas market

The LGBTQ\* community's Christmas market attracts a diverse crowd thanks to the buoyant mood that predominates here. And of course everything sparkles in the most beautiful of pinks.

### 6 Haidhauser Christmas market at Weißenburger Platz

The warm and welcoming atmosphere at this Christmas market makes it very popular - some believe that it is the most beautiful Christmas market in Munich. There is live music almost every day and a program of events for children that makes little eyes shine.

### Märchenbazar (fairytale bazaar) in the Olympic Park

Nostalgic circus tents create a sense warmth and coziness, an old film set in the middle of Munich's Olympic Park serves as a cozy bar, delicacies from all over the world can be found here - and a moon goddess invites you to story time.

### Christmas market at Münchner Freiheit

This Christmas market was established by a group of artists and restaurateurs over 40 years ago. To this day, it enchants visitors with an art tent, a sculpture trail and a variety of installations.

### Bahnwärter Thiel and Alte Utting


During the Christmas season, the grounds of Bahnwärter Thiel, an alternative cultural center, are transformed into a Christmas carnival – with open studios and workshops, heated tents, fire pits and an enchanted marketplace. There is also a Christmas market on the nearby "Alte Utting", once a pleasure boat. Concerts are held in the belly of the ship.

### 10 Christmas market at the Chinese Tower

Here you can enjoy the holiday season in what looks like a scene from a picture book: stalls encircle the snow-dusted tower in the middle of the English Garden, a children's carousel goes round and round, and mulled wine steams in mugs.



Almost everyone wants to experience something special on New Year's Eve. Luckily, that is very easy to do in Munich.

Be it an exquisite meal in a restaurant, a wild party in a club or a joyful crescendo at a New Year's concert, there is something going on everywhere in Munich on New Year's Eve. At midnight, the whole city pours into the streets to welcome in the New Year with colorful fireworks. Please note that fireworks are prohibited in large parts of Munich's historic city center. This is one of the reasons why we recommend heading for a vantage point such as the Olympiaberg, Monopteros or Friedensengel. And after New Year's Eve? Many museums offer unique exhibitions during the period "between the years" (which ends with the public holiday on 6 January 2025). How about a visit to the Bavarian National Museum, for example, which has the most extensive and artistically valuable collection of nativity scenes in the world?
